This funding will be used to

- maintain the number of students in Prep-2 achieving an A-C in English at <90%.
- maintain the number of students in P-6 achieving an A-C in English to <85%.
- increase NCCD, Indigenous and children in care students achieving an A-C in English to <85%.
- continue to build teacher capability in the teaching of reading and spelling and extend data literacy skills.
- increase the number of students achieving school spelling benchmarks to 75%.
- increase the range of student support services and programs to enhance wellbeing, student engagement and improve student attendance to 90%.
- build teacher confidence in delivering the Australian Curriculum in Enghlish through the collaborative assessment of student work (CASW).

Our initiatives include

- implementation of early years oral language programs and age appropriate pedagogies.
- provide professional development opportunities for teachers and teacher aides in the teaching of spelling and implement 'The Beachmere Way' for teaching spelling.
- providing opportunities for staff to engage in the collaborative assessment of student work (CASW) to develop teacher understanding of the intended curriculum and increase consistency of A-E judgement
- individual case management of students through short data cycles.
- build teacher capacity through CASW check-in meetings, learning walks, extending data literacy skills and ensuring reading, writing and spelling data sets are analysed, and driving teaching and learning programs.
- engage in regional professional development opportunities and with external curriculum experts to develop teacher capacity in differentiation, curriculum delivery and consistency of judgement.
- reduction of class sizes to cater for individualised learning programs and increased support.
- implementing Positive Behaviour Learning (PBL) and Reboot initiatives to increase student engagement, resilience, attendance and reduce student disciplinary absences (SDA) and behaviour referrals.
- purchase high interest home readers and additional Accelerated Readers readers for identified levels.
- purchase additional digital technologies to ensure teachers and students have access to the required digital resources for quality teaching and learning.
